These two aspects of piety must be realized realistically in the relationship with the creator and the relationship between humans (Omar Muhammad al-Toumi al-Syaibani, 1979). Education, in general, means directing and guiding given by someone who functions towards developing others towards something to aspire to (Suwarno, 1992). In contrast, Islamic education means the efforts of Muslim adults who are devoted to directing and guiding, including spiritual, physical, and mind, towards the growth and development of the nature of students through Islamic teaching.

To increase faith and devotion to the creator, it is necessary to participate actively in social and religious activities and recitations to have a solid foundation and not easily influenced and falter when exposed to various temptations and trials. The term or mention of narcotics is more often used by law enforcers such as the police and the National Anti Narcotics Agency (BNN), court officials such as prosecutors, judges, officers in correctional institutions, and the public, in general, who are more familiar with the term narcotics. Another term usually used by health practitioners, such as doctors and nurses in hospitals and rehabilitation centres, is the term drug. But basically, the term's meaning still refers to the same three substances. Drugs are materials or substances that are not included in the food group. If consumed by drinking, smoking or injection, it will affect the working system of the brain (central nervous system) and cause dependence, which results in the work of the brain becoming unstable (increasing or decreasing) and will also affect the function of other vital organs in the body, such as the liver, respiratory system, and blood circulation. (Sri Rezeki, 2014). If drugs are consumed not following the prescribed usage rules, they will create changes in behaviour, mental and physical.

Based on law no. 22 of 1997 elaborated on the meaning of

Narcotics, Substances or drugs derived from plants or non-plants, both synthetic and semi-synthetic, can cause a decrease in consciousness, loss of feeling, relieve pain, stimulate enthusiasm, and cause dependence.

2. Psychotropics, Substances or drugs, both natural and synthetic, non-narcotics have psychoactive properties through a selective effect on the central nervous system. It causes specific changes in mental activity and behaviour.

3. Other addictive and psychotropic substances or materials can lead to dependence on users (Alifia, 2008).

According to health experts, drugs are intended to anaesthetize patients who are about to be surgery or drugs for certain diseases. However, drugs are widely abused in this increasingly sophisticated era, and their use is beyond the dosage limit. From a pharmacological point of view, narcotics are used only to relieve extreme pain; when used, they must be careful and under the doctor's direct care. Drugs are chemical substances that can change psychological states such as feelings, thoughts, moods, and behaviour if consumed by eating, drinking, inhaling, and injecting.
